Who We Are

Our Mission:

Savannah is a city of tensions: black and white, rich and poor, conservative and liberal, historic and creative. These tensions, and the conflict they cause, make this city the glorious ruin that it is. There are really only two ways to live in the midst of this conflict: you can pick your tribe and go to war with the Other; or, you can live in a story that honors, and yet encompasses, the tensions of life in the Garden of Good and Evil. At Christ the King- Savannah, we believe that the good news of Jesus is that story. So our mission is simple: to be a community that helps people **Love God, Love Neighbor, and Love Savannah.**

Our Values:

To be a community like this, we need to know a few things:

- 1. <u>Formative</u>- we believe that Christian worship is not just an expression of our feelings; it is a formative habit that enables us to worship God in all of life. Its a workout for the soul, that stretches us. As a result, we don't look to worship to make us feel a certain way- we look to worship to introduce us to something- or Someone- who exists outside of our feelings.
- 2. <u>Family</u>- The Christian life is never lived alone. This is especially true in the context of our lonely, rootless modern world. The Christian life is lived in the context of thick relationships of mutual dependence on one another. The church is not a Sunday morning experience- it is our primary identity marker. You can't just do CTK on Sunday morning.

 3. <u>Friendly</u>- We are family formed by the Gospel, that strives to have a positive stance towards our city. We do not retreat from the world, even though we disagree with it. We strive to love it, to seek the good in it, and to partner with that good. We strive to make space for people who did not grow up in the church or share our presuppositions. Christ did the same for us.

Childcare

We are glad you are here. Your kids- we are glad they are here too! Kids help keep us from taking ourselves too seriously, so your noisy kids are welcome in our service. If you need a break, childcare is provided for the duration of the service for children ages 0-2, and children's church begins prior to the sermon for 3-5 year-olds.

God's Table

Communion is not a Presbyterian meal. It is a meal for the Christian family. If you have made a public profession of faith and are in good standing in a Christian church, communion is for you.

We come forward to take the bread from the pastor and eat immediately, symbolizing our unity with the church throughout time. We hold our wine until we can drink together, symbolizing our unity with one another.

If you are concerned about COVID, individual communion packets (gluten free) are available up front.

Grape juice is on the outside ring, wine on the inside ring.

What is Communion?

The Words of Institution- 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.
